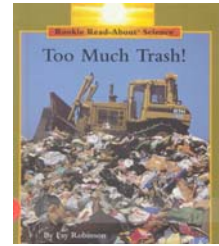

Summary: Turn a wheel or lift a flap to find out how recycling can help save natural resources and reduce garbage!

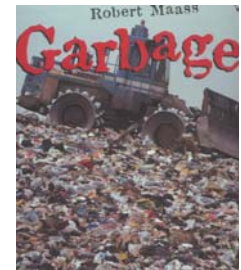


Title: Garbage

Summary: This book uses large colorful photos show the journey of garbage from the trashcan to the landfill. Provides a good introduction to concepts associated with garbage.

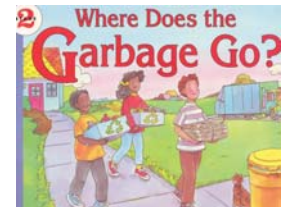


Title: Where Does the Garbage Go?

Summary: Colorful illustrations show the effects that garbage has on our environment. Includes easy ways for young students to make less garbage.

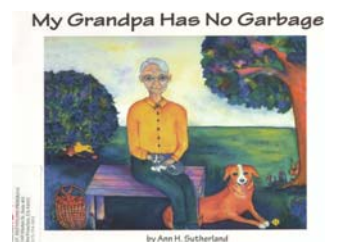


Title: My Grandpa Has No Garbage

Summary: A fun story about a grandpa who reduces the amount of garbage he makes by composting his leftovers, and reusing items like coffee cans and cloth dish towels.

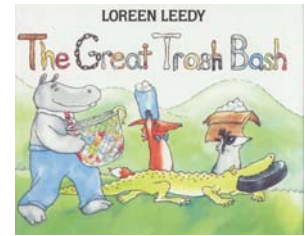


Title: The Great Trash Bash

Summary: Comic book style illustrations tell the story of the trash laden town of Beaston and how the animal inhabitants of the city reduce their waste.

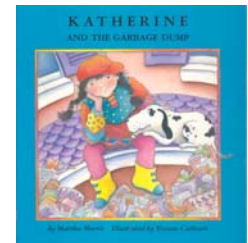


Title: Katherine and the Garbage Dump

Summary: This book outlines the problems associated with garbage and offers fun solutions and activities to solve the dilemma.



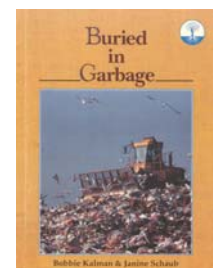

Summary: This book gives a historical account of garbage and includes interesting garbage facts, as well as global perspectives on garbage and recycling.

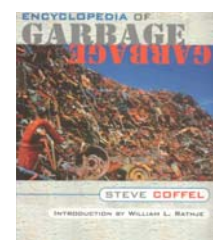


Title: Encyclopedia of Garbage

Summary: This comprehensive encyclopedia on garbage also covers related topics ranging from acid rain to the impact of our rapid population growth. Excellent reference book.

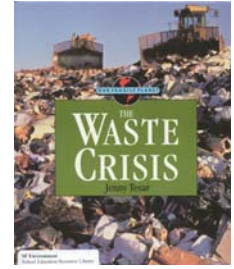


Title: The Waste Crisis
